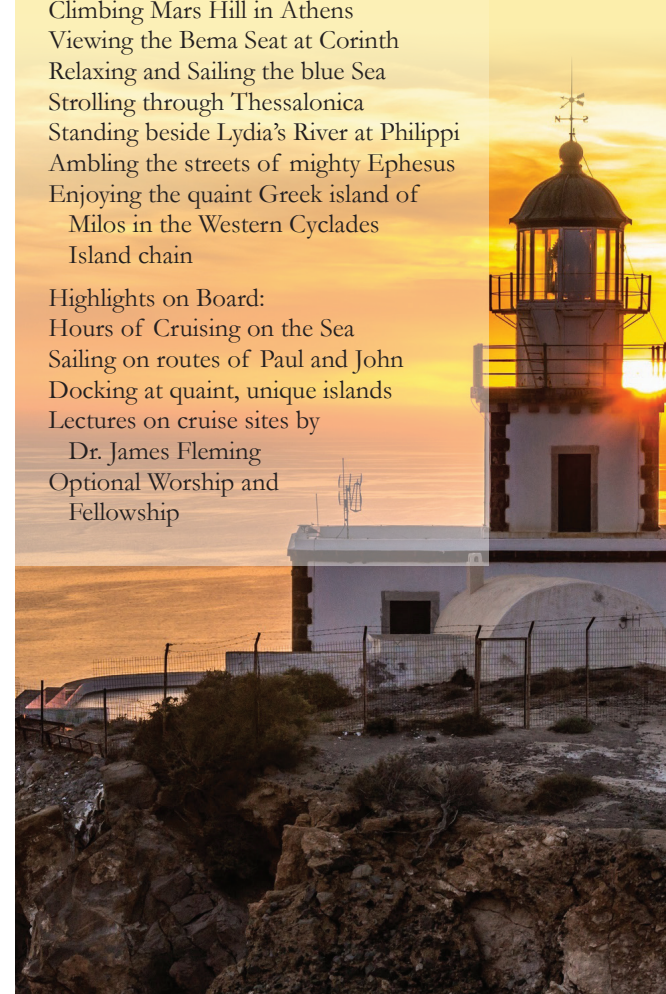

**Sept. 15, Saturday** - We depart from the US to Athens

**Sept. 16, Sunday** - Arrive in Athens and met by our tour guide. We'll transfer to our hotel. The remainder of the day will be free time. Welcome Dinner and Overnight in Athens D

**Sept. 17, Monday** - Athens - Mars Hill, Acropolis

Begin Cruise.

Following breakfast this morning we tour Athens, the foundation of democracy. We will visit the Acropolis Museum and then on to the Acropolis, the Parthenon, and Erechtheum before viewing Athens atop Mars Hill where Paul stood and preached. From atop Mars Hill we view the Agora below, the ancient marketplace and center of Athenian public life. Additional sites viewed during our panoramic bus tour are, the House of Parliament, the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Olympic Stadium, and the Presidential Palace. This afternoon we transfer to the Athens port of Piraeus and begin the second chapter of our adventure on a 7-day cruise of the Greek Isles. Overnight and evening entertainment on board. B/D

**Sept. 18, Tuesday** - Mykonos - Cruise

We spend the day today exploring the quaint isle of Mykonos, called the island of windmills. Experience the waterfront lined with shops and cafes and then stroll the charming walkways through a maze of whitewashed buildings before returning to the ship. Overnight and evening entertainment on board. B/L/D

**Sept. 19, Wednesday** - Milos - Cruise

After breakfast there will be an optional lecture by Dr. James Fleming on St. Paul. The Greek Island of Milos, in the Western Cyclades Island chain, is a surprise for the traveler adventurous enough to take a detour from Santorini, Mykonos and the other popular islands. Milos, like Santorini, is an island that is not only rich in spectacular sunset views and minerals but also in the things that travelers come to



Greece looking for: beautiful beaches, inspiring views, a rich history, white-washed Cycladic villages, excellent food and good-hearted people. Overnight and evening entertainment on board. B/L/D

**Sept. 20 & 21, Thursday & Friday** - Cruise- Santorini

Enjoy the next two days exploring the island of Santorini.

Santorini is perhaps the most breathtaking of all the Greek Islands. You may choose to take an optional panoramic bus tour viewing some of the most spectacular scenery of the Aegean. Travel through many villages and settlements with delicate architecture and beauty and eventually arriving in Oia. During your time in Oia, visit the many narrow streets, open-air cafes and glittering boutiques. Upon returning to the ship, we view the ace-like caldera, the little islands of Thirasia, Palea & Nea Kameni. Overnight, evening entertainment on board. B/L/D



**Sept. 22, Saturday** - Crete - Cruise

Crete is the largest and the most rugged of the Greek islands. Take a tour to Heraklion and the fantastic ruins of the Palace of Knossos. Discovered in 1899 and partially reconstructed, the elaborate Palace is believed, by some, to be the mythical Labyrinth of King Minos and the seat of ancient Minoan culture. Overnight, evening entertainment on board. B/L/D

**Sept. 23, Sunday** - Ephesus - Cruise

After breakfast there will be an optional lecture on Ephesus. Docking in Turkey, enjoy a tour of Ephesus, the city of the Bible and one of the largest restorations still in progress with miles of ancient treasures. Ephesus was once a thriving port town of 250,000 people. Today you can still see the spectacular excavations of the major streets in this ancient city including the Agora, the Odeon, the Library, the marble-paved main Street, the Baths, Trajan's Fountain, the Residences of the Patricians, the Prytaneum, and Temple of Hadrian. The Great Theatre, built in the 4th century B.C. could accommodate 24,000 spectators is famous even nowadays for its acoustics. Evening optional lecture on Corinth in the New Testament. Overnight, evening entertainment on board. B/L/D

**Sept. 24, Monday** - Disembark Cruise/Mycenae/Thessalonica

We will travel to Mycenae where the remains of the ancient city date back to the Bronze Age to see the famous Lioness Gate, the Tomb of Agamemnon in the shape of a Beehive, and many other sites. We will travel to Corinth Canal and then on to the ancient city of Corinth. It is the city that inspired two of Paul's most familiar letters. See the Archaeological

Museum, the Market Place, the Bema, and the Temples. To enjoy a reflection in the midst of the ruins of the church of Corinth and see the pillars, steps, and public worship place where Paul preached will enhance



your understanding of I & II Corinthians. The ruins of this important cultural center are fascinating as we walk along the stone paths that the Apostle Paul walked. The engineering skill and intellect of these people are evident in the harbors and roads that still serve the people from antiquity to modern day. Take an afternoon flight to Thessalonica. Dinner/Overnight in Thessalonica. B/D

**Sept. 25, Tuesday** -Thessalonica/Philippi, Romans Road/Lydia's Spring & Kavala

After breakfast, we will enjoy a full day learning about the Apostle Paul and his work with the early church as we visit Philippi and Kavala. The Book of Acts will come alive to us today as we tour the delightful harbor city of Thessalonica. We will view the old city ramparts; the newly excavated Forum, St. George Church, an ancient Roman monument which was transformed into a church and the Galerius Arch which rises over the famous Via Egnatia. We'll visit St. Demetrius Basilica, dedicated to a distinguished member of the Roman army and a martyred Christian convert.

Kavala is Greece's prettiest mainland port with a most elegant harbor. Paul landed here with his disciples, Timothy and Silas. This ancient city of Neapolis was later renamed Christopoulos because it was the first European city to receive Christians. We will see the Roman Aqueduct and the ruins of the Acropolis in this beautifully located city, known since the 5th century as Kavala. We will continue on to Philippi where Paul preached and baptized the first Christians on European soil. We will view the baptismal site where Lydia was baptized and visit the forum where Paul, Silas and Timothy were arrested. Dinner and Overnight in Thessalonica B/D

**Sept. 26, Wednesday** -Vergina

This morning we enjoy a visit to King Phillip II (Alexander the Great's father) tomb in Vergina, one of the most outstanding archeological finds in all of Greece.

We will stop for lunch as we drive back to Athens. Farewell Dinner and Overnight in Athens B/D
